



REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS: RNZ/NZ On Air JOINT INNOVATION FUND: DIVERSE JOURNALISM

Introduction

In July 2018 the Minister of Broadcasting, Communications and Digital Media announced that a fund was to be established that will pilot a new type of joint collaboration between RNZ and NZ On Air with the intent to strengthen public media contribution to New Zealand society.

The fund comprises three project categories: Signature Projects, Growth Audiences, and Diverse Journalism. RNZ is to be the primary platform(s) for all projects*.

Purpose

RNZ and NZ On Air are now seeking proposals for the category of Diverse Journalism.

For the purpose of this request for proposals **Diverse Journalism** is defined as News, Current Affairs, factual content, and related supporting activities and initiatives.

Projects

RNZ is seeking proposals for the following projects;

1. Daily News Podcast

It will provide a narrative hard-news examination of 1-3 stories of the day that are of high relevance to New Zealand and would act as a "news explainer", giving the detailed background to a story.

Budget: Up to \$400,000,

Publishing period: Monday to Friday, 10 months

2. Te Ao Māori: Primarily a Podcast series, with multi-media elements**

A Te Ao Māori view - exploring the issues affecting the daily life of urban Māori communities throughout the country.

Budget: Circa \$80,000

3. NZ Game industry: A multi-media project**

Who makes them, who plays them – the financial and social impact.

Budget: Circa \$80,000

4. Migrant experience: Primarily a Podcast series, with multi-media elements**

The experiences and voices of recent migrant communities in NZ.

Budget: Circa \$80,000

Multi-media is defined here as using more than one medium of communication. In the context of the **Diverse Journalism strand, this is likely to look like a range of mixed-duration media formats that deepen the storytelling approach (e.g. podcasts, text, video, images, interactive storytelling etc).

Editorial control

RNZ has full editorial control after the decision to fund a project is made.

Budget

Budgets may vary depending on the scope of each project.

Notes

You will be required to upload a creative proposal in pdf format as part of your <u>online application</u>. This pdf should be a maximum of 3 pages and contain;

- A one-line synopsis
- A one page concept outline
- Description of the primary target audience
- Research plan outline your approach to research
- **Production plan/schedule** include planned key deliverables and production milestones from commencement to delivery of the content.
- The proposed RNZ platform(s) on which the project will be available.
- Budget
- **Key personnel** who are the intended key personnel on the project? Please include one paragraph per person and a link to their bio if available.

No more than 4 project concepts in total may be submitted from each production company and/or producer.

If a project is shortlisted, we may ask for additional information.

Subject to the quality of proposals, we intend to select one of each of the 4 projects.

Submission and Assessment Process

18 October	4pm deadline for 1-3 page(s) proposal submitted via the online application portal.
27 November	Letters advising of either confirmation or decline.

Proposals will be assessed by the RNZ/NZ On Air representatives of the joint assessment panel.

Reserved Rights and Terms and Conditions

The following government standard terms and conditions apply to the RFP and the RFP process:

- a. you must bear all of your own costs in preparing and submitting your proposal
- b. you represent and warrant that all information provided to us is complete and accurate

- c. we may rely upon all statements made in your proposal
- d. we may amend, suspend, cancel and/or re-issue the RFP at any time
- e. we may change the RFP (including dates), but will give all submitters a reasonable time to respond to any change
- f. we may accept late proposals and may waive any irregularities or informalities in the RFP process
- g. we may seek clarification of any proposal and meet with any submitter(s)
- h. we are not bound to accept the lowest priced conforming proposal(s), or any proposal
- i. if none of the proposals are acceptable to us we may enter into negotiations with one or more of the submitters (if any).

- k. our obligation to protect your confidential information is subject to the Official Information Act 1982 and other legal, parliamentary and constitutional conventions
- I. there is no binding legal relationship between us, and your proposal is only accepted if we both sign a funding contract
- m. our Request for Proposals (RFP) comprises this document, and any subsequent information we provide to suppliers
- n. the laws of New Zealand shall govern the RFP process
- o. in submitting your proposal you are deemed to have read, understood and agree to be bound by these terms and conditions, and the additional terms and conditions below, if applicable.
